Primary Debating Competition Year 4, 5 and 6

Dates:

5th November 2024: Debating Skills Training Day at Waterside Campus 21st January 2025: Competition Day at Waterside Campus

Develop oracy, confidence and critical thinking through debate training with Noisy Classrooms. Each school will participate in a debating training day at UON to learn debating skills to take back and practice in schools. After the day of training, along with the resources supplied, students will develop their skills back in school to take part in a Northamptonshire Primary Schools competition in January 2025. Students debate in two rounds and receive expert judging and feedback.

The winner of the Northamptonshire heat will get the opportunity to compete in the National competition - the Cicero Cup - taking place in London in the summer of 2025.

Teachers will receive CPD and a handbook to support with debating back in school.

School Tasking Year 5

Do you and your pupils love watching Taskmaster? We're excited to announce that the University of Northampton is joining over 25 other universities in this year's School Tasking initiative, inspired by Channel 4's Taskmaster.

This project lets Year 5 students explore the law through fun, interactive tasks.

Classes will be split into teams of 5-6 students who will compete against other local and national schools to become School Tasking Champions. Tasks include drawing, word searches, role-playing court cases, and using Lego to depict legal scenarios. Each student can showcase their unique talents, and the initiative helps develop teamwork, communication, and problem-solving skills.

The final competition promises spirited rivalry and lots of fun!

Take One Picture Year 4

for Northampton Primary Academy Trust Schools only

The UON Take One Picture project is a collaboration between the University, Northampton Primary Academy Trust (NPAT) and The National Gallery, London which aims to improve learning and teaching of art, writing, and 21st Century skills including children's self-belief, motivation, empathy and critical thinking.

The National Take One Picture project invites schools and educators to teach children by focusing on a single picture from The National Gallery's collection. Last year the painting selected was Pieter de Hooch's The Courtyard of a House in Delft (1658).

Art students from UON will take up residence in 10 NPAT schools to assist teachers and school children from Year 4 to develop their thinking, making skills and their understanding of art. Students will create a final piece of work to be displayed at UON.

All art work will be displayed either digitally or physically in an inspiring display at Waterside Campus in a formal art exhibition. NPAT schools will be invited to visit the university to see the exhibition and loved ones will be invited to a special private viewing of the exhibition.



Word Warriors Year 5, 6, 8 and 9

Available to all-through schools only

Dates: Flexible
Location: Your school with a celebration event
at University of Northampton
£350 bus bursary available

Word Warriors is a mentoring reading programme where older pupils are trained to mentor younger pupils to encourage them with their reading. After a successful secondary school pilot last year, we're excited to expand the opportunity for mentors to read to primary students.

This project benefits both readers and mentors. Younger readers enhance their reading skills and academic success, while older mentors gain confidence, leadership skills, and improved attendance. This year, the expanded Word Warriors program will serve as an ideal transition project, offering targeted support to primary students.

Programme Structure:

- Participants: Up to 15 Year 5/6 students receive one-on-one reading support.
- Mentors: 15 Year 8/9 students will undergo a 2-hour training course to effectively engage with younger readers.
- Duration: 14 weeks
- Support: Year 5/6 students will have 10 x 1-hour sessions, designed by The Literacy Trust, with The Saints Foundation. Pupils will develop values of rugby such as Teamwork, Respect and Sportsmanship, as well as, reading skills of a champion: Looking ahead, Clue Level and Thinking Level.
- Celebration: At the end of the programme, all participants will be invited to the University of Northampton for a celebratory event.



Additional Opportunities & Resources

Dental Health Workshops Key Stage 2

Dates: January to July 2025
Location: In schools
Available to multiple classes, with up to
30 students per workshop.

KS2 dental workshops for primary schools in Northamptonshire, facilitated by trained NHS Nurses within the Dental Nursing team at the University of Northampton.

The workshops last around 1 to 1.5 hours. They focus on promoting oral health care, covering topics like toothbrushing, diet, basic anatomy (tailored to the audience's age), along with interactive activities such as dressing up and singing.

Pre SATs Revision Resources and Careers Cards

We have a series of resources including printed leaflets, posters and packs of our Careers Cards game for you to use to support the progress and aspirations of the children within your school.

This includes a variety of KS2 English, Maths and Science resources for your students which reinforce key information required for SATs.
